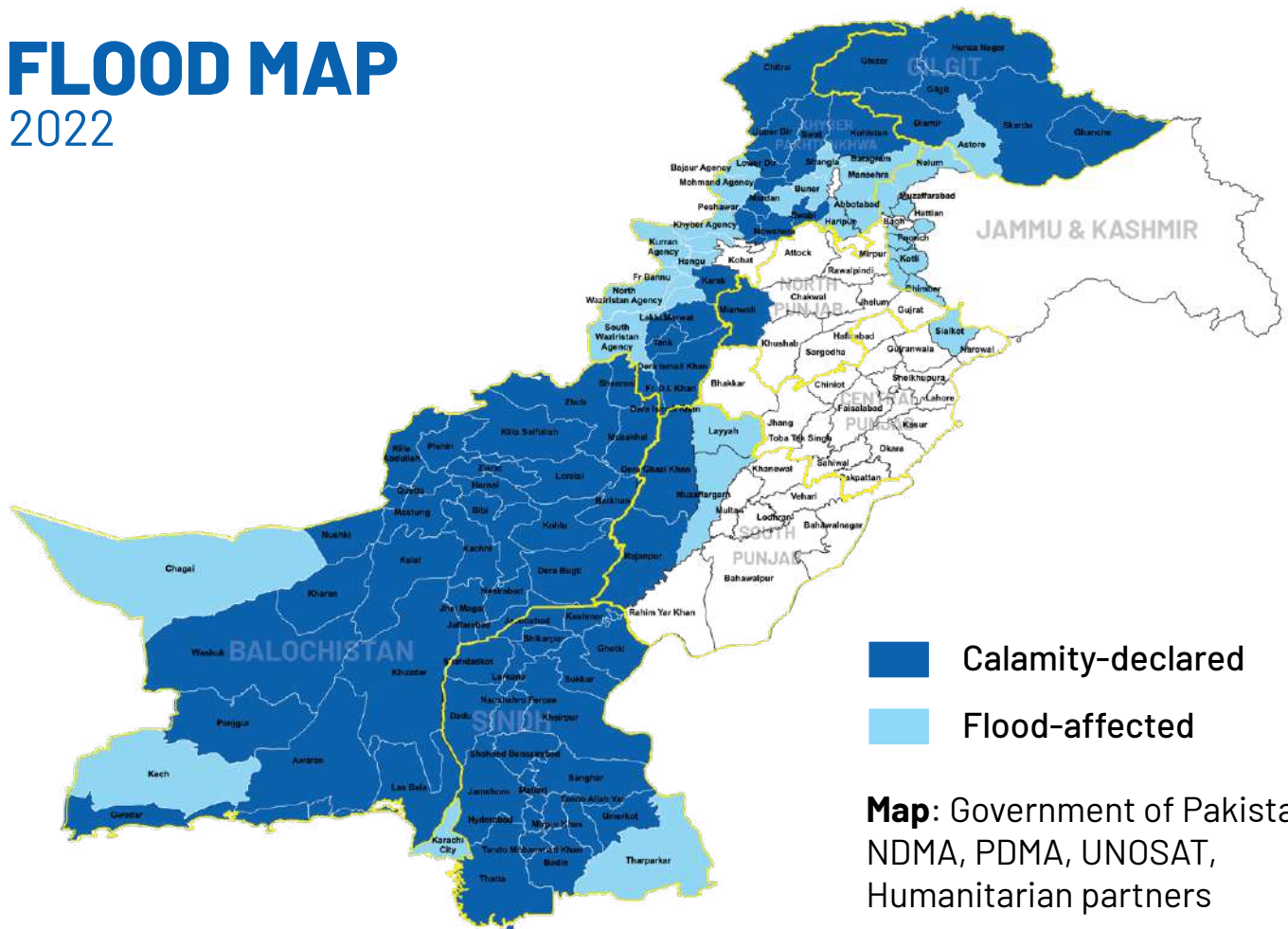

Alkhidmat **Flood Response**

A series of recent nation-wide public opinion polls, conducted by IPSOS and Gallup Pakistan, reveal that Pakistanis hold high levels of trust in Alkhidmat's emergency response efforts. We are recognized as one of the most-trusted civil-society organisations in Pakistan for humanitarian assistance.

Alkhidmat's enabling infrastructure of extensive on-ground volunteers, relief trucks and rescue boats has helped generate a swift response. Our priorities were devised based on the various themes of humanitarian crises that have emerged as a consequence of the floods.

As per government assessment, more than 1700 people have lost their lives.	The Alkhidmat rescue and relief operation helped evacuate thousands of people to safer places.
Nearly 10 million people were displaced after floods damaged over 2.2 million houses.	Alkhidmat arranged shelter for flood affectees in tent villages, camps and is now assisting in the reconstruction of houses for them.
Educational activities are suspended in the flood-affected areas for the last 4 months.	AlKhidmat has set up a number of Temporary Learning Centres (TLC) along with free stationery for children, and is now reconstructing flood-damaged schools.
120 districts are facing acute hunger and food crises.	Alkhidmat has been ensuring constant supply of food in flood-affected districts by delivering dry rations and two cooked meals daily and is now supplying agri-inputs to farmers for sowing next crops.
Flood affected areas lack primary health services and maternal healthcare facilities.	Modern mobile health units, medical camps together with field hospital are working to provide medical healthcare in flood-hit areas and now we are working to upgrade all health units.
There is a severe shortage of clean drinking water in the flood affected areas.	AlKhidmat has taken many initiatives to alleviate water shortage, providing 200, 000 people with clean drinking water every day and is now actively installing water systems nationwide..
Deprived communities are facing lifesaving sports challenges again.	Orphan support program has been started under Alkhidmat Tameer-e-Watan Program.

ALKHIDMAT RESCUE ACTIVITIES







RESCUE

Besides colossal human and material losses, the devastating floods also wreaked havoc to communication infrastructure including roads, highways and bridges where millions of families were stranded in neck-deep flood waters, hampering relief operations thereof.

Alkhidmat Foundation Disaster Teams deployed personnel, equipment and 43 boats and transport vehicles to evacuate the stranded families, women and children into tent villages set up by Alkhidmat at dry and safe places.

VOLUNTEERS

Unrelenting flood disaster also strained existing resources and services, making it very difficult for affected communities to get the help they might need, causing utmost human resource crises for relief organizations too.

Incredible work and support by 62,805 Volunteers helped Alkhidmat Foundation fill gaps between resources and services. They played a key role while rescuing the stranded families, shifting them into relief camps, setting up tent villages for them, as well as distributing essential supplies such as food and non-food items.

RELIEF TRUCKS

910 relief trucks loaded with metric tons of relief goods were dispatched to flood affected areas across Pakistan containing supplies, such as dry ration, clean water, jerry cans, medicines, clothes, shoes, toys and milk for children as well as hygiene kits, delivery kits and winter kits. Large-scale continued supplies by the Alkhidmat Foundation helped families survive the grave food and water crises during floods.

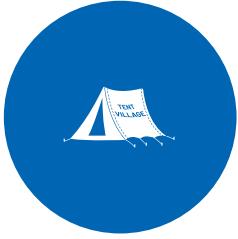

TENT VILLAGES (SINDH, BALOCHISTAN, PUNJAB, KPK)

Floods left nearly 10 million people displaced after more than 2.2m houses were significantly damaged across Pakistan.

Alkhidmat volunteers set up as many as 69 tent villages in safe and dry places that were not at risk of flooding across the country together with cooked-food, clean water and other basic facilities. Establishment of such large-scale tent villages not only provided private space and shelter to thousands of families, but also helped them come to terms with life after floods again.

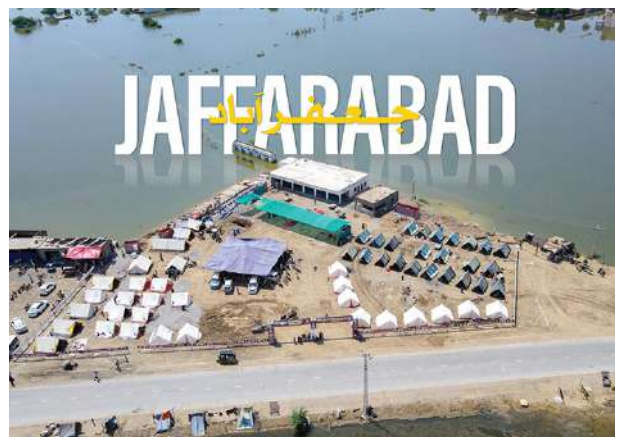
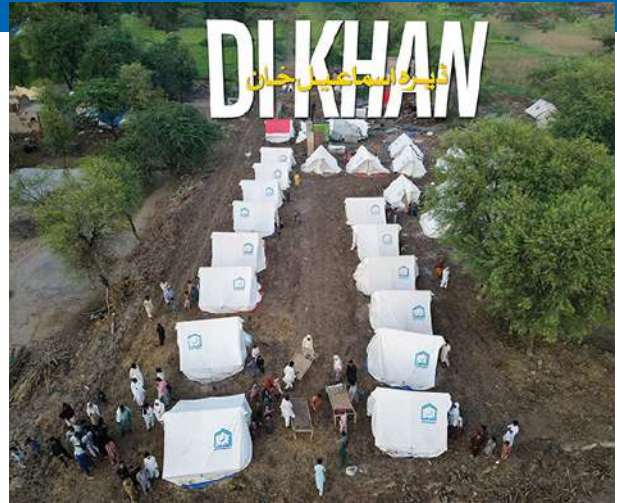

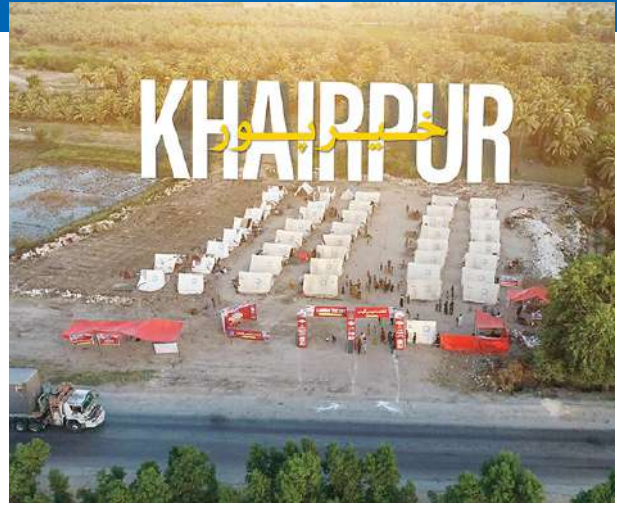

ALKHIDMAT KITCHEN

Devastating flooding in Pakistan swept away crops and stockpiles and left large areas of farmland under water, further aggravating the scarcity of food and nutritional supplies in the country, especially for expectant mothers, women, children and infants.

Alkhidmat set up as many as 41 kitchens, with twice a day cooked-food facilities, across the country to ensure food security for families, children and infants in flood-affected areas.

FAMILY FOOD PACKS

To solve the superimposed crisis of emerging food insecurity over the flood-stricken nation, Alkhidmat Foundation has readily stepped up despite the increasingly adverse circumstances to reach as many affected families as possible. We supplied 217,140 families with various forms of food commodities including wheat, rice, pulses, oil and clean drinkable water among other food and non-food items to alleviate the growing burden of food shortage in the flood-affected population.

COOKED MEALS (TWO TIMES A DAY)

Food insecurity and malnutrition reached emergency levels in flood affected areas, with potentially disastrous long-term consequences for the survival and wellbeing of children who were already suffering from malnutrition. Millions of families in flood-affected areas needed emergency food assistance.

Throughout the crisis, Alkhidmat reached as many as 85,200 affectees including women and children who were provided with constant cooked-meal supplies twice a day.

MEDICAL CAMPS

Around 900 health facilities were damaged in the country, of which 180 were completely destroyed, leaving millions of people without any access to basic healthcare amenities and medical treatment. Alkhidmat Health organized a total of 2,000 medical camps in flood affected areas across the country, providing 658,949 patients, suffering from various diseases including malaria, typhoid and other waterborne diseases, with free of cost check-ups, tests, treatment and medicines.

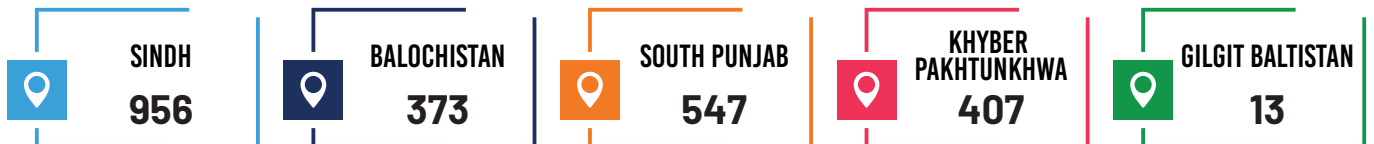

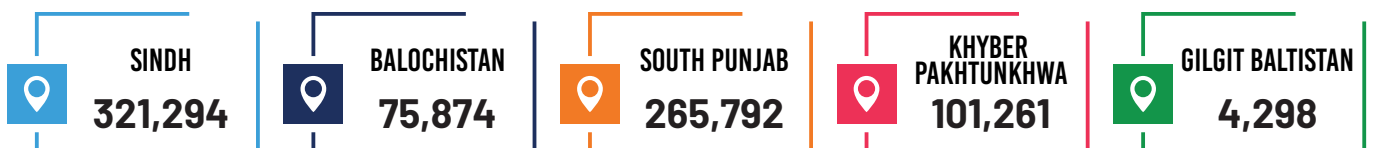

MOBILE MEDICAL UNITS

60 mobile medical units were arranged by Alkhidmat Foundation in collaboration with local and global partners to provide health services in the areas where hospitals were inaccessible for patients after roads and bridges were damaged due to floods.

Alkhidmat Mobile Medical Units designed with a proper bed for patients along side the facility of air conditioners, pharmacy and sitting place for doctors and paramedics. Alkhidmat Health Department and Pakistan Islamic Medical Association-PIMA worked together to provide health services including check-ups, tests, consultations and medicines to affectees across the country.

FIELD HOSPITALS

In the wake of increasing morbidity rate in flood affected areas, Alkhidmat continued its efforts to help flood victims by establishing Field Hospitals.

6 field hospitals were set up by the field team with the assistance of Alkhidmat Health Foundation and Pakistan Islamic Medical Association-PIMA. At field hospitals, medical teams treated flood victims coming from remote flood-affected areas who had water-borne, viral and communicable diseases.

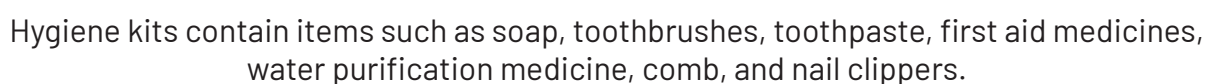

As a response, we did what we could to prevent a widespread public health emergency by delivering over 52,109 personal care hygiene kits together with dignity kits containing items such as soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, cups, first aid medicines, water purification medicine, combs, nail clippers and feminine hygiene products.

MOSQUITO NETS

In the wake of massive floods are left behind large bodies of stagnant impure water which provide a dangerous breeding ground for mosquitoes, insects, viruses and bacteria hence creating a high risk of multiple vector-borne diseases.

Alkhidmat Foundation has helped provide 321,500 mosquito nets to families of infants, young children, pregnant women and the elderly to ward off a vast majority of highly-endemic transmissible diseases such as malaria, dengue fever, leishmaniasis, chikungunya and typhoid.

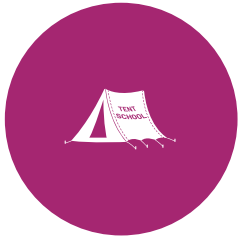

TEMPORARY LEARNING CENTERS (TLC)

Educational activities for more than 2 million children in Pakistan remained inaccessible after severe floods destroyed nearly 27,000 schools across the country. In collaboration with its partners, Alkhidmat established 17 temporary learning centers in tent villages that helped resume academic activities as well as the emotional well-being of thousands of flood affected school-age children including boys and girls.

MOBILE WATER FILTRATION PLANTS

Damage to enormous number of water supply systems, means of communications, roads and bridges resulted in millions of people in far-flung remote and rural areas no longer having access to safe drinking water and being cut off from regular water supplies from nearby cities.

31 mobile water filtration plants were dispatched in the peripheries in order to continue supplying clean water to the affected communities that were cut off from the nearby cities.

Rehabilitation of Flood Affectees

Reconstruction of Houses

Alkhidmat is providing financial assistance to the affected families, helping them purchase building material, galvanized iron sheets, iron girders, blocks and bricks to name a few. Alkhidmat has planned to provide financial assistance for the reconstruction of as many as 10,000 houses in flood-hit areas across the country.

Upgradation of Health Units

Health units will be upgraded to better ensure the provision of basic health services to affected and resident communities in flood-hit areas across the country.

Farmers Support

Each farmer, owning land size of 1 to 5 acres, will be supplied with Agri inputs, seeds, fertilizers and pesticides worth PKR 100,000.

Employment Support

Alkhidmat is providing financial support to workers, who have lost their jobs due to the recent floods, for helping them set up their own startups like grocery stores, stationery shops and other small businesses.



Orphans Support

Three thousand (3,000) orphans aged 5-10 in the flood-affected districts will be included in the Alkhidmat Orphan Care Program. Under the Alkhidmat Orphan Care Program, orphans will be provided health, food, and education until they reach puberty.

Clean Water Program

Various Clean Water Projects have been started in order to ensure clean drinking water supply to the populations in flood-affected areas. PKR 250 million has been allocated for these projects.

Reconstruction of Schools & Masjids

Alkhidmat has also started the reconstruction and repair of completely or partially damaged schools, Masjids and madrassas. An initial plan has been set up for the reconstruction of 200 schools and Masjids.



RECONSTRUCTION OF HOUSES

To rebuild the 2.2 million devastated abodes nationwide, Alkhidmat has launched the Tameer-e-Watan Program for the rehabilitative construction of homes of the flood victims rendered homeless by the massive inundation.

Alkhidmat is providing assistance for flood-damaged house reconstruction. Some common types of assistance include full financial aid for rebuilding and the provision of building materials for repairs.

REHABILITATION OF SCHOOL

Alkhidmat is deeply concerned about the worrisome disruption of educational activities after floods had destroyed thousands of schools across the country. As an immediate response, Alkhidmat set up temporary learning centers at tent villages to help resume academic activities in an emergency.

And now Alkhidmat school rehabilitation project includes the process of repairing, renovating and updating existing school buildings to improve the physical condition and functionality of the facility.

REHABILITATION OF MASAJID

Sadly, thousands of Masajid, including many historic ones, were severely damaged by floods in areas across Pakistan. As a result, millions of devotees were deprived of congregational prayers while young children and students faced disruption of Quran classes. As a response, Alkhidmat launched the Masajid Rehabilitation Project and has been providing financial assistance for the reconstruction of flood-damaged Masajid in flood affected areas.

SUPPORT TO FARMERS

Damage caused to farmlands and Kharif crops are beyond estimates that have left millions of small farmers unemployed and in an economic nightmare where they were in no position to sow the next Rabi crop.

Alkhidmat initiated farmer rehabilitation projects thereof small farmers, having less than 5 acres of land, were helped out with agricultural inputs for sowing the next Rabi crops.

Support to Orphans

Thousands of water reservoirs, freshwater streams and clean water facilities in hardest hit flood areas of Pakistan have suffered major damage, leaving already vulnerable communities exposed to increased risk of disease, especially women and children. Alkhidmat has started various clean water projects in order to ensure clean drinking water supply to the populations in affected areas across Pakistan. PKR 250 million has been allocated for these projects.

UPGRADATION OF HEALTH UNITS

Public health facilities in hardest hit flood areas are facing a dire shortage of essential medical supplies, staff and equipment, resulting in the overburdening of the already compromised healthcare services.

Alkhidmat is upgrading health units as well as mother-child-healthcare services in flood affected areas to better ensure the provision of basic health services to affected and resident communities, especially women and children in flood-hit areas across the country.
