



DISASTER MANAGEMENT













Disaster is a word that brings thousands of peril thoughts in one's mind. It reminds us the tough times of earthquake that struck Northern Pakistan back in 2005, the cruel memories of flood that washed-out a huge part of Pakistan in 2010 and several terrorist attacks, accidents and other catastrophes. Name of Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan also comes to the minds of thousands of people whom Alkhidmat served during those hard moments through its Disaster Management Services.

Rescue

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan has instructed its rescue teams to start working for the rescue operation across Pakistan without waiting a single moment after occurrence of a disaster. The moment a disaster, accident, calamity or any other catastrophe hits an area anywhere in Pakistan our local rescue team activates itself and starts rescue work. Clearing dead bodies and evacuation of injured & stranded individuals to medical services as well as to their homes & safe Places in different urban or rural areas is the priority of our rescue services.

Relief

Relief is the Prompt assistance services provided by Alkhidmat's Disaster Management Program to the affectees of regions where calamity occurs. Alkhidmat gives sustenance bundles, clean water, garments & apparel, sleeping bags, cooked food for endangered families and individuals with the help of its donors and partner NGOs.

Rehabilitation

Restoring the life of affected people through reconstruction of the trodden infrastructure of communities is the objective of our rehabilitation service. We reconstruct or repair the damaged houses, mosques, water sources and other required buildings to help restoring the habitat of those who face sudden disasters. Alkhidmat Foundation has built and handed over scores of houses to surge and shudder influenced families till date.

Emergency Once Again!

In 2015, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan responded to many emergencies and disasters. Including Floods, Earthquakes, Bomb blasts, Road accidents and Famine in Tharparkar, we also worked to make a long-term difference in disaster-prone areas through capacity building of local communities to deal with future emergencies.

Flood 2015

On July 16, 2015, Chitral and adjacent areas were stricken by torrential rains that continued for about 4 days and caused heavy damages. More than 40 connecting bridges were destroyed and several villages had been under water. In Gilgit Baltistan, the melting of the Glaciers at various points added to the miseries of the area.

A huge area was affected by flash floods covering scores of villages and small living settlements. People were helpless to spend their days and nights under open sky as the flood had destroyed their houses and other sources of shelter. Due to destroyed infrastructure it was also difficult to reach them for their help. Affected people were hopeless as they were bound in their locations as the connecting bridges and roads were washed away by heavy flood.

Keeping in view the entire situation, AKFP Volunteers reached the affected areas, launched the rescue operation, badly stranded people were evacuated from calamity stricken areas and transferred to safe places.

Earthquake 2015

An earthquake of 8.1 magnitude on Richter Scale originating from Hindu Kush mountain range jolted the major cities of Pakistan including Lahore, Islamabad, Rawalpindi, Peshawar, Quetta, Kohat, Malakand and various Northern areas of Pakistan causing more than 450 casualties in Chitral, Dir Lower, Dir Upper, Buner, Swat, Bajaur Agency, Gilgit-Baltistan, Kallar Kahar, Sargodha, Landi Kotal and Kasur. More than 3000 injured people had been reported. The extent of damage was very high due to severe damages to infrastructure and means of communication had also been disrupted by the earthquake.

Alkhidmat conducted rescue, relief and rehabilitation operation for the victims of this natural disaster and helped a huge number of affected people. Alkhidmat helped the victims by removing debris of the demolished houses and provided first-aid to the victims while seriously injured people were taken to the hospitals.

HEALTH SERVICES













Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan has always strived to serve the poorest and needlest segment of the society. Keeping in view the situation of poor infrastructure of health sector Alkhidmat started many projects with an aim to improve health facilities for the general public, regardless of their socio-economic status.

Alkhidmat foundation has devised a health program for establishing and administrating many Mother and Child Healthcare Centers, Hospitals, Mobile Medical Camps, Ambulance Service, Diagnostic Centers and Blood Banks across Pakistan.

Completion of MCHCs

Mother and Child Health Care (MCHC) is the health service provided to mothers (women in their child bearing age) and children.

Two New MCHCs in Bannu and Lower Dir are now operational, as they have started working in 2015. The projects were completed exactly in the given time frame and now are open for the service to patients of the areas. MCHC of Bannu was primarily aimed to give health services to the IDPs of Bannu IDP Camp while the other hospital was a dire need of district Dir.

Taking Lead Again! (Ambulance Fleet Management)

Alkhidmat Ambulance Fleet is another step ahead towards the attainment of its goal of serving the humanity. The system is the result of our devotion and commitment to the cause of humanity. Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan has been serving the nation for decades in the field of health through its various health projects including ambulances.

Since the situation in all provinces is not suitable in regarding health and ambulance service, Alkhidmat decided to establish a well-equipped, planned, efficient and centralized ambulance fleet system. This Ambulance Fleet is currently a pilot project which will be replicated across the country after its successful completion. Currently the project is being tested simultaneously in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Alkhidmat Ambulance Fleet is equipped with various powerful gadgets and technological advancements including:

- Complete management of urgent and programmed services, from the first call (which will be recorded), the operator's handling of the issue, the dispatch of the ambulance service, through to the provision of updated service status in real time, and service finalization.
- Control and tracking of the ambulance fleet, monitors the position of ambulances through continuous connectivity with the help of wireless system. It doesn't only increases the efficiency of the service but also augments lifesaving process in emergency situation.
- Management of the in-cabin services, involves the replenishing the required resources in the ambulance according to set operating procedures. The highly qualified crew; paramedic and supporting staff, keeps the in-cabin management according to required level.
- Document management, for the preparation of patient records during traveling and the handling of all necessary documentation related to patients, vehicles, workers, etc.

Male and female students are in equal ratio in the beneficiaries list of our education programs as we are pursuing the goal of 100 percent literacy rate in Pakistan.

During 16 years of Alfalah Scholarship Scheme it has empowered 2711 students to become a contributing part of the society while the number of scholars during year 2014-2015 had reached the milestone of 1400 students. 171 doctors, 331 engineers, 208 associate engineers, 155 Master's degree holders, 206 B.S Hon. degree holders, 329 graduates, 853 students of intermediate and 458 secondary schools students were sponsored this year.

Child Protection Centers

In its continuous effort of educating vulnerable Childrens of Pakistan, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan is busy in implementing different type of educational projects. One of them is establishment of Child Protection Centers for street children. Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan has established 6 protection centers for street children to bring normalcy in their life. The qualified and dedicated staff is providing free education and lunch to alleviate their sufferings and to enable them to become good Muslims and good citizen.

Youth Skills Development

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan understands the importance of skills for the youth. In this program young individuals are given vocational training to help them acquire required skills in a specific trade. Alkhidmat Foundation outsources the training to renowned training service providers to ensure the quality and program delivery of the training while it has also established Skills Development Center in Charsadda, to provide skills to the youth.

This Skills Development Center is to foster economic development in Charsadda at Hazrat Ayub Ansari Model Village by establishing local livelihood opportunities by providing vocational training to local community members in specific territorial trades.

Hazrat Abu Ayub Ansari is a model village, established by Yardimeli - Turkey to facilitate the flood affected families of Charsadda. This Skill Development Center is a wonderful addition to uplift the living standard of the village. Alkhidmat, as local implementing partner has planned to train around 200 individuals in three different trades. These skills will help them finding suitable jobs or starting their own business.


Microfinance & Enterprise Development Program

It is always the poor, deprived and downtrodden people who suffer the most in any society. Poor people are the most prone to any natural or man-made calamity in any area. They are also the first to get caught of the issue and the last to recover from it. Alkhidmat has organized several projects in an effort to alleviate their suffering to the possible extent. Alkhidmat's community services address suffering caused by poverty, physical disabilities, and incarceration. Alkhidmat addresses these issues by organizing the following humanitarian projects:

Ramadan Food Packages

The ramdan Program is a seasonal Project of Alkhidmat Foundation which addresses food insecurity and eases the economic burdens of the poor during the holy month. Our Ramdan foods packs are designed, as per the international standards for nutrition, to meet the needs of a family of seven to eight members for the whole month.

Before distributing these food packs, Alkhidmat foundation in collaboration with village committees, selects families who are the most vulnerable and in need including female headed household, people with disabilities and families consisting of orphans.

Qurbani Campaign

Muslims all around the world are rejoiced at the arrival of Eid al-Adha. This beautiful festival, one of the two most important in the Islamic world, marks the end of Hajj and symbolizes Prophet Abraham's complete obedience to God. From delicious breakfasts, to joyful family gatherings and generous offering of sacrifice meat to the poor, Eid ul-Adha offers a beautiful solace to the pain-stricken Islamic world.

In such times, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan arranges its Qurbani project that helps thousands of Muslims to enjoy their Eid along with whole Muslim Ummah. This year, the project reaches to more than 700,000 needy and deserving peoples. Alkhidmat Community Services program delivered Qurbani meat among those who mostly can't afford to buy it during year.

Construction & Rehabilitation of Masajid

Masajid are the fundamental and sacred places of worship for the Muslims. Masjid is the basic need of Muslim Community in any area as it is the place for offering five times prayers as a religious obligation. Masajid are also the main source of Religious Education. Children of local communities go to Masjid to learn about Islam and Islamic Teachings and this can only be possible if there is a Masjid available to the nearby community. Their construction, repair, maintenance and rehabilitation to retain them in good condition is the rudimentary obligation of every Muslim.

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan has constructed & rehabilitated 60 Masajid across Pakistan. 8,400 beneficiaries have benefited from these Masajid. These Masajid have been continuously helping to local communities by providing them praying facility at nearest place and also an opportunity to fulfil their religious duty of offering prayers regularly. Construction and Rehabilitation of Masajid has helped the local communities across Pakistan as they can now offer prayer and can perform religious activities nearby their houses and shops with an ease. Now, local communities also have the facility of Quran classes and Islamic Education for their children in these Masajid. They are very happy and thankful to Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan.

THARPARKAR - SINDH

Thar is the largest desert of South Asia and lies to the South East of Pakistan. The accordingly named district Tharparkar, more commonly called Thar, rates very high on the indices of poverty, food shortage, insecurity, deprivation, maternal and child mortality and malnutrition. Our on ground survey has yielded valuable insights about the core issues faced by district Tharparkar.

Alkhidmat in Tharparkar

Alkhidmat has been working in Tharparkar since 1997 with an established network of on ground local volunteers to supervise:

- ZamZam Project A clean water initiative aimed at digging water wells for the scattered rural population of the desert.
- Al-Ilm (Chawnra School) Project A village based one teacher one room school that provides free primary education.
- Al-Ilm Sanvi Project Educational scholarships are awarded to bright students of Chawnra schools who desire to attain further education.
- Mawakhat An interest free micro-finance initiative that facilitates unemployed individuals in setting up their own sources of income.

- The overall population suffers from malnutrition problems due to frequent droughts.
- Tharparkar and its Tehsils namely Mitthi, Diplo, Islamkot, Nagarparkar, Chachro and others have the highest poverty rates.
- The district has the highest maternal and infant mortality rate in Pakistan.
- The population lives in scattered groups locally called Paras, which are situated away from the main roads and often cannot be seen by the outside world.

Thar Complex

Alkhidmat has planned a 10 acre multi-purpose complex in the poverty stricken desert district of Tharparkar with following facilities:

- Mother & Child Healthcare Center (MCHC)
- Islamic Center & Masjid
- School, College & Hostel
- Water Filtration (RO) Plant
- Veterinary Hospital
- Vocational Training Center
- Aghosh Alkhidmat (Orphanage)
- Community Support Center
- Ambulance Service

MULTIPLE INDICATOR STUDY OF THAR (MIST)

Tharparkar (Mitthi), district of Sindh province is located in South East corner of Pakistan. Government and Non-government organizations are working to provide as much relief as much possible to the calamity hit region but there was a need to look for some permanent solution. For this purpose Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan conducted a research that highlighted several issues to be addressed for the betterment of the people of Thar.

Research Objectives

Thar Development Program (TDP) is an initiative of Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan aimed at uplifting the life at village level. For objective assessment of TDP, Alkhidmat found that relevant, authentic and updated information was not available. The sole objective for the research was "Assessment of existing needs and potential capabilities" at village level regarding:


Alkhidmat Foundation has a large number of trained volunteers who have rendered rescue and relief activities all around the world including Sri Lanka, Lebanon, Bangladesh, Burma, Japan, and Afghanistan. Alkhidmat sent its team to Sri Lanka to provide relief to the Tsunami victims where they were also responsible for rehabilitation of local community especially rebuilding of schools.

During Israel-Labnon conflict Alkhidmat's volunteers provided ration and medical relief to the war victims of Lebanon. Alkhidmat also provided its services in Bangladesh, where it offered relief to the flood affected people by distributing dry ration. Recently, Alkhidmat also provided services to the refugees dwelling on the border of Turkey and Syria. In 2015, A Delegation of Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan visited Indonesia and Malaysia for providing Relief to Rohingya Refugees and also sent a team of doctors to support the rescue and relief activities in Nepal for earthquake affectees.







