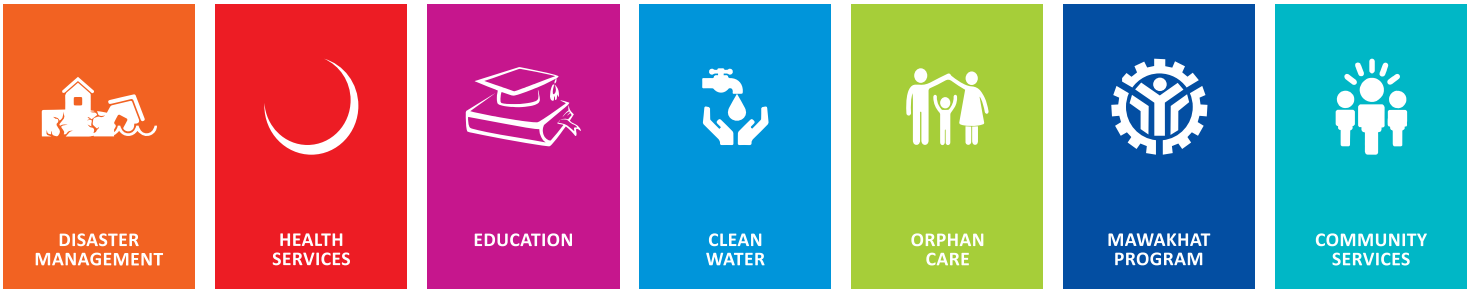

Disaster Management

Disaster Management has become an uproar today as Pakistan has been facing several natural and man-made disasters since last decade. While understanding the importance of Disaster Management, Alkhidmat has devised a system that ignites automatically in any emergency situation across Pakistan. While observing the prompt necessities, fleeting requirements and lifelong needs of calamity influenced individuals, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan has divided Disaster Management into following subdivisions:

- Preparedness
- Research & Development
- Rescue
- Relief
- Rehabilitation



Flood

Rainfall Emergency and Flood 2016

Heavy rainfall and deadly windstorms hit Pakistan all through out the rainy season this year. Rawalpindi, Islamabad, Peshawar, Lahore and other parts of the country recorded heavy rain on 1 June; claiming at least 15 casualties and injuring 173 people. Heavy rain also affected the city of Quetta.

Alkhidmat Disaster Management and its trained volunteers were always there in all provinces of Pakistan to save lives of thousands of people this year. Rescue, Relief and Rehabilitation from Alkhidmat Foundation touched its peak this year as more than 100 ambulances took 3,980 injured and 190 dead bodies to hospitals; distributed 4,980 ration packages and 10,000 liter clean water among flood affected people. The total number of beneficiaries reached 9,249 individuals.

Man-made Disasters

Bacha Khan University Charsadda & Gulshan Iqbal Park Attack

Volunteers of Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan were the first to reach Bacha Khan University Charsadda on 20th January, 2016 when 4 terrorists entered and opened fire at the students of the university. At least 21 people including students and staff members of the university were killed and over 60 got injured.

Likewise, the bomb blast in Gulshan-e-Iqbal Park Lahore, on the occasion of Easter, the suicid attack took lives of 72 people including men, women and children who had come for picnic. It also left 340 injured among whom 8 lost the battle of life at hospitals while several left the hospital with permanent disability. Volunteers of Alkhidmat Disaster Management reached blast site and started rescue operation to save as many lives as they can. Several injured people were transported to near hospitals among which many survived after treatment.

Keeping in view the poor situation of infrastructure at government run hospitals, Alkhidmat started many projects with an aim to improve health facilities for the general public, regardless of their socio-economic status. Alkhidmat Foundation has devised a health program to implement its vision for health by establishing and administrating many Mother and Child Healthcare Centres, Hospitals, Mobile Medical Camps, Ambulance Service, Diagnostic Centers and Blood Banks across Pakistan.

Ambulance Fleet Management

Alkhidmat Ambulance Fleet is another step ahead towards the attainment of its goal of serving the humanity. This ambulance fleet is currently a pilot project which will be replicated across the country after its successful completion. Currently the project is being tested simultaneously in Gujranawala, Gujrat, Rawalpindi and Peshawer, Alkhidmat Ambulance Fleet is equipped with various powerful gadgets and technological advancements including:

Free Medical Camps

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan also arranges Mobile medical camps as its out-reach program to provide medical and health facility to those who can't afford it. These camps provide specialized medical staff for the patients at their nearby place. They provide initial diagnostic facility through qualified medical staff to the patients. Patients are examined and prescribed for initial treatment according to their symptoms and sometimes they are referred to a suitable medical facility.

In 2016, AKFP arranged more than 416 medical camps in far flung areas of Pakistan.

Alkhidmat kept sponsoring my education through Alfalah Scholarship Scheme until I completed my Intermediate. Later, I got admission in Degree College Mithi for my graduation.

Today, I am a teacher at the same primary school and teach around 100 children. I think, I am a success story for many of my students, as many of them also want to become teachers and help other poor children to study.

Male and female students are in equal ratio on the beneficiaries list of our education programs as we are pursuing the goal of 100 percent literacy rate in Pakistan.



School Supplies

There is a substantial number of unfortunate understudies in Pakistan, especially in remote, rural and slum ranges of Pakistan, whose families can't bear the cost of school bags, books, shoes, and other necessities. Alfalah Scholarships

This educational scholarship program is run with cooperation of Alfalah Scholarship scheme. Scholarship arrangement has been operating for some years, and many underprivileged, however talented, understudies have had the capacity to finish their education through Alfalah Scholarship Scheme. As of 2016, 863 scholars, from universities and colleges are getting scholarship. To date, 3,225 students have availed this scholarship and other educational support from Alkhidmat Alfalah Scholarships. Furthermore 637 students have finished their degrees to work honorably in their particular fields.

Alkhidmat Schools

Alkhidmat works for construction of new schools and also helps the existing institutions as a team with distinctive however ideologically arranged elements, for example Ghazali Education Trust, Baithak Schools System, and READ Foundation AJK. Alkhidmat has built an unfathomable system of schools, both in urban, and rural areas, giving quality education that keeps tabs on improving intellectual capabilities of students. The syllabus taught at these schools has been prepared as per breakthrough, scholarly prerequisites. There are particular vocational courses for males and females.

Skills Development Centers

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan understands the importance of skills for the youth. In this program young individuals are given vocational training to help them acquire required skills in a specific trade. 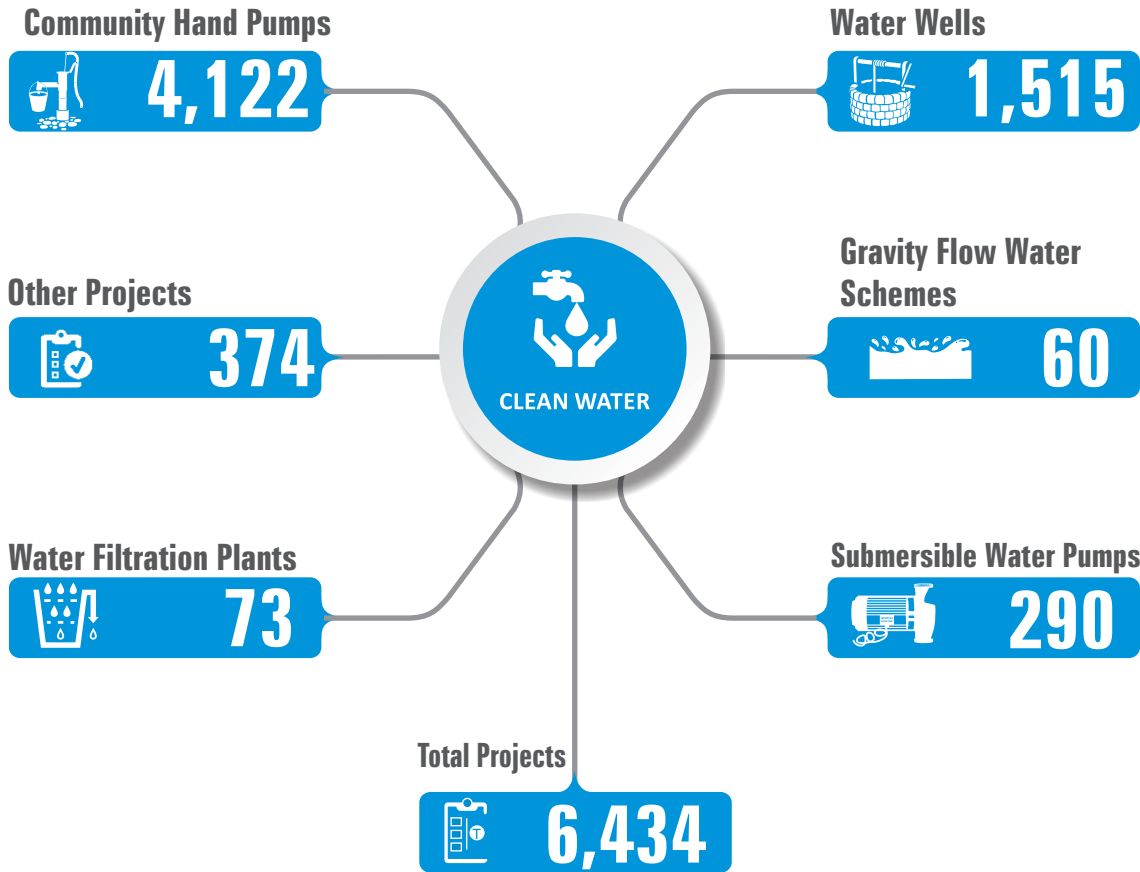
Clean Water Safe Life

Drinking water of our area was contaminated as we had sewerage mixed with water due to the poor sanitation. It was causing serious health problems in the community and additionally we did not even have regular water supply because water authorities had put it to halt without any notice.

Alkhidmat Foundation visited our area and examined the poor situation conditions. They installed a water filtration plant which helps all residents of the area to get clean drinking water. The whole community is now happy and I, Riaz Ali, on behalf of my community, am very thankful to Alkhidmat for the water filtration plant.

Clean Water

Water is life but here in Pakistan, a huge part of population is deprived of clean drinking water. Alkhidmat Clean Water program provides practical solution for drinkable water.

Water Filtration Plants (RO)

Water filtration plants of Alkhidmat Foundation provide an advanced system for water purification through Reverse Osmosis (RO). Purification is the process of removing undesirable chemicals, biological contaminants, suspended solids and gases from water. The goal of this process is to produce water fit for drinking purpose.



Community Hand pumps

Community Hand-pump is the best possible and most economical solution in most of the areas of Pakistan. It helps the community to protect their water reservoir from almost all types of contamination and pollution. Here only a basic pump serves the whole community consisting scores of families to avail their required water.



Water Wells

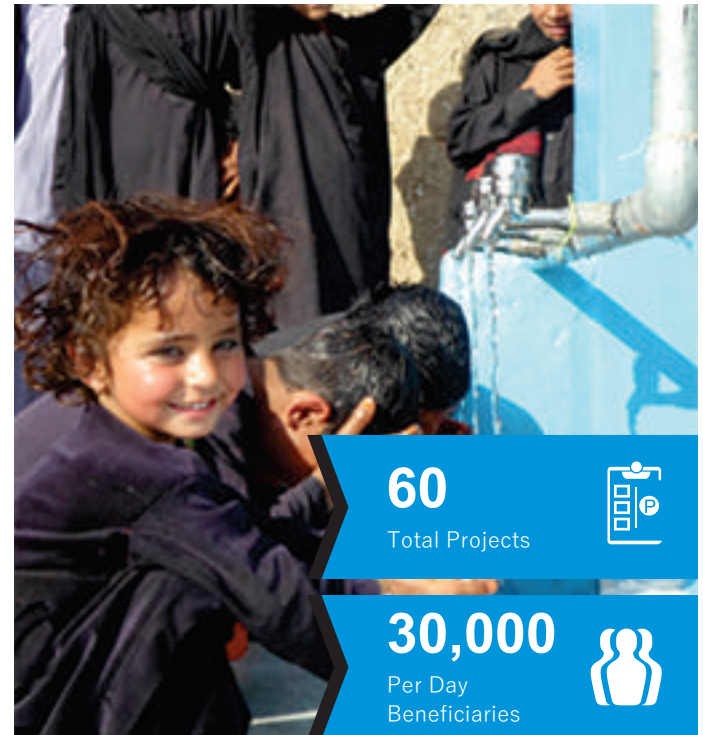
Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan provides safe and healthy drinking water in remote areas through a traditional source: 'water well'. Water wells help people getting their required water and this underground water is automatically filtered when it seeps up to the ground. Water in the water wells is safer than the water in ponds and ditches.



Gravity Flow Water Schemes

Gravity flow water scheme is an efficient and cost effective scheme that helps a community to store the naturally flowing water, especially from waterfalls, in a larger tank at a community's common place. Water is

taken from natural flows and brought to a common community tank through water pipes, where community members come and easily avail the desired quantity of water in their own containers.



Clean Water Safe Life

The Issue of water borne disease has alarmingly increased in the country and our people are unaware of its long-term consequence on their lives. Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan opted an awareness campaign, 'Clean Water Safe Life' to bring this issue in the limelight and spread awareness in the society on the occasion of World Water Day, which is marked on March 22 every year.

The campaign consisted of a series of several activities across Pakistan including seminars, categorized lectures in educational institutions and awareness walks. Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan also adopted a versatile way for spreading awareness.







Smile of Orphans

I and my siblings became orphans when our father died of lungs cancer in 2010. After his death my mother started working to run the family. Then Alkhidmat Foundation took responsibility of our sponsorship.

Now we all go to school regularly where I am studying in class 8, Anees is in class 7 and Amina is in class 4. We perform well in our studies, and in recent examinations Anees stood first in his class. Anees wants to join armed forces of Pakistan as a doctor while Amina and I want to become teachers. Along with formal education, I am also getting vocational training of embroidery at a center to support my family. (Anees)

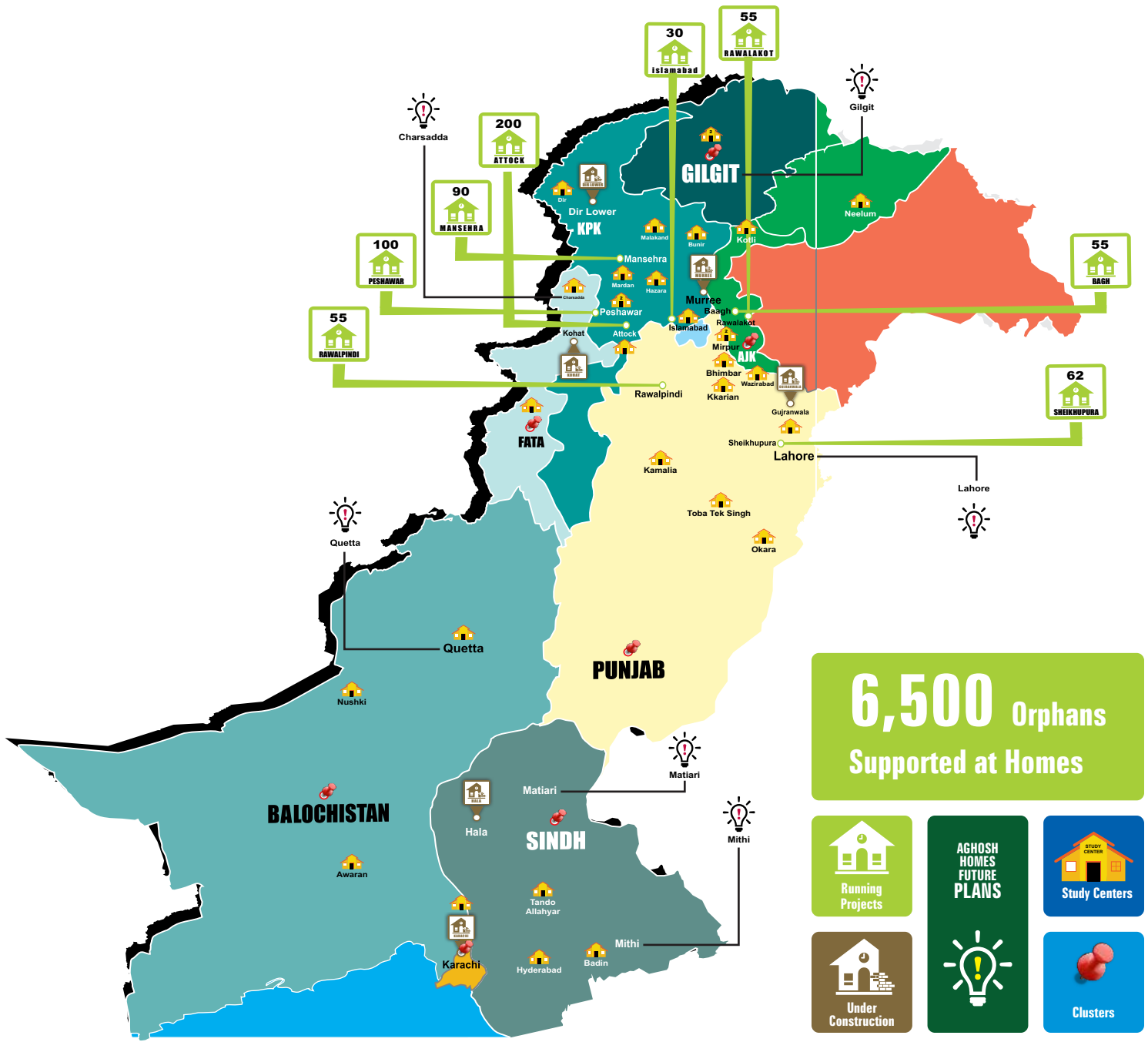

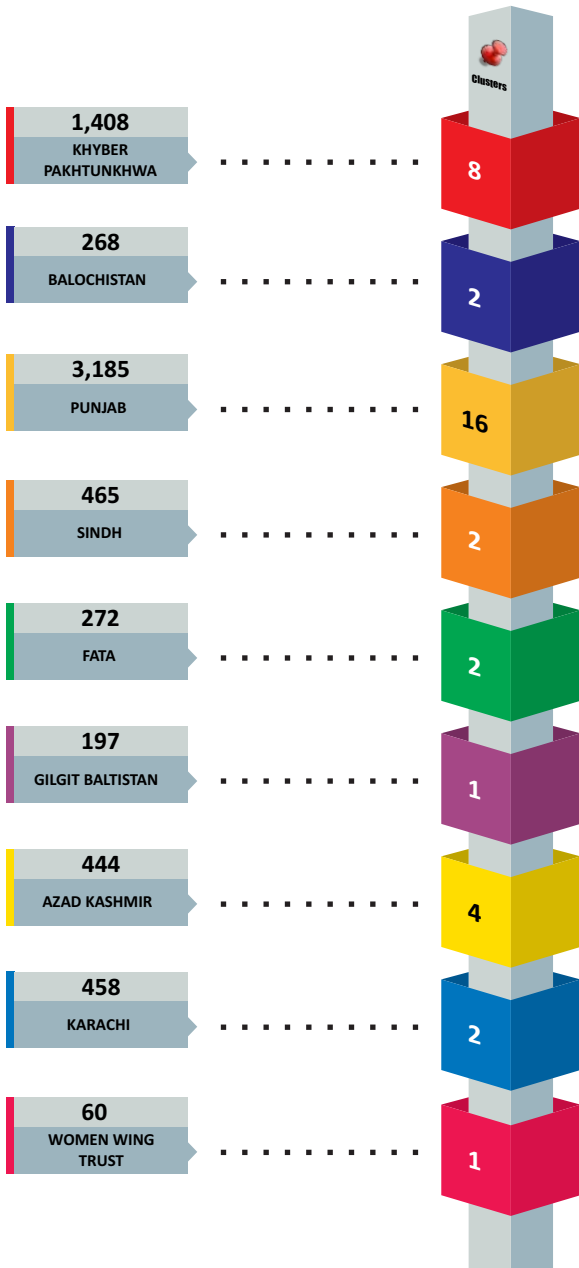

Green Pakistan Day

Pakistan has highest deforestation rate in Asia (Dawn, June 2010). Keeping in view the grave situation, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan held awareness walks with the theme of “Green Pakistan Day” across the country. Walks in other parts of the country with the same theme and spirit were organized. The sole purpose of the campaign is to create awareness among the masses about significance of forests and plantation of new trees.



Child Character Development Program

The main purpose of “Child Character Development Program” (CCDP) is to develop “Study Centers” in various areas of Pakistan. They assist in identification of needs and personality grooming of sponsored orphans & their guardians through value based contents.

Alkhidmat Foundation took the initiative for this purpose and developed 33 study centers across Pakistan.



OFSP Team In Operations Through ERP:

Alkhidmat Orphan Family Support Program has a dedicated team across Pakistan: the central office is connected with Family Support Organizers (FSO), regional offices and clusters through Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP). This approach has enabled Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan to reach out the orphans at their doorsteps and fulfill the requirements for the bright future of these neglected children. Alkhidmat has brought a major change in this segment of the society.



World Orphans Day

According to UNICEF's survey, Pakistan is home to approximately 4.2 Million orphan children. Moreover, a major percentage of these orphan children are deprived of adequate nutrition, education, health facilities and other basic facilities. The number of orphans (hundreds and thousands) makes the task of assisting them extremely difficult.

Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan decided to celebrate the 15th Ramadan as 'World Orphans Day' (Youm-e-Yatama). The event was collectively celebrated under the umbrella of Pakistan Forum for Orphan Children, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan and some other education imparting NGOs. Pakistan Forum for orphan children organized walks, seminars, conferences and special lectures in various educational institutions, throughout the country to celebrate the event.







Do Good Have Good

Shweta is an expert in making handicrafts. She had been running her business in her community for a long time but due to her limited resources she was unable to expand her business. She approached Alkhidmat Mawakhat Program for interest free loan to increase the volume of her business and reach out the local market. Alkhidmat Foundation approved her loan which helped her to hire new staff and buy more raw materials.

Now she is able to meet the market demand and the competition. Her business is growing at a great speed. To bring a positive change in her community, she is also training local girls so that they can also become independent like her.

> Mawakhat Program (Islamic Micro-Finance)

The program's name 'Mawakhat' is based on Islamic values that provide the poor with interest-free loans so that they may acquire a livelihood, skill to earn and support their needs to reach their full potential. The program is based on the principle of Qarze-e-Hasna (micro-finance), helping someone in need with interest-free loan.





Small Business Loan

Under the Small Business Interest Free Loans, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan provides cash support to the borrowers who utilize the loans to expand their existing businesses. The beneficiaries are supposed to return the loaned amount within an agreed duration. Alkhidmat doesn't charge any interest on the loan.



Liberation Loan

Liberation Loans are provided for the payment of loans obtained from money lenders who charge heavy interest rate. Alkhidmat Mawakhat Program pays the principle amount to liberate the borrowers. The borrowers return the loaned amount to Mawakhat Program within an agreed tenure.





Smile with Happiness

I am Rajab Ali, 18 years old and physically challenged. I live in village Wadero Su Khaskheli, a remote area in District Thatta, Sindh. My village is known as the village of disabled people for locals as there are around 20 families in the village and most of their members are disabled. The life in our village was full of misery until Alkhidmat Foundation came to our help.

Alkhidmat Foundation not only provided me with wheelchair but the whole village is the beneficiary of Alkhidmat's Wheelchair Distribution Program. Now we have got our mobility and can regularly visit nearby hospital to get ourselves examined by doctors.

Community Services

With the kind collaboration of its donors and partner organizations, Alkhidmat Foundation Pakistan distributes food packages among those who can't afford buying their required ration. These ration packages help a number of deserving persons to observe their fasting with ease and comfort.



Qurbani

Alkhidmat Foundation also distributed Qurbani meat among the residents of Syrian refugee camps with the kind support of Hayrat Aid Turkey and Cansuyu Turkey, same as we did in Pakistan. Happiness of Eid was shared with those homeless people who are still in the need of continuous help and support from the world.

I have given due consideration to the record and report submitted by the Performance Evaluation Committee and I am of the opinion that M/S Al-Khidmat Foundation Pakistan, Lahore duly complies with the requirements of the relevant income tax rules and merits approval under Section 2(36) of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001. Therefore, the applicant's request for grant of renewal approval as a Non-Profit Organization is hereby approved subject to following conditions:

1. This approval is valid for a period of three tax years i.e., for Tax Years 2017, 2018 and 2019 and shall expire on 30-06-2019 unless withdrawn earlier;
2. The applicant shall apply afresh under the prescribed rules for re-evaluation of its status as a Non-Profit Organization in terms of Section 2(36) of the Ordinance at the end of the expiry period i.e., 30-06-2019;
3. During the period mentioned at serial No. 1, the NPO shall comply with all the relevant provisions and rules including Section 100C of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001 and Chapter XVII of the Income Tax Rules, 2002. In case of violation of any legal provisions or relevant rules, the approval shall stand withdrawn ab-initio, i.e., with effect from Tax Year 2017.
